On May 4, 1988, [REDACTED] advised that ISNA was sponsoring the above conference scheduled to be held at the KANSAS CITY AIRPORT, MARRIOTT HOTEL. [REDACTED] advised that the theme of the conference is to be "Financial Alternatives for Muslims in America." In addition [REDACTED] advised that the conference was also co-sponsored by the ISLAMIC SOCIETY OF GREATER KANSAS CITY (ISGKC). [REDACTED] advised that the program identified speakers for the conference which included ~~IQBAL ANUS, ISNA Secretary General;~~ JAMAL BARZINJI; NAZIRRIDIN ALI; IMAM IMTIAZ ALI; YAQUB MIRZA; AHMAD ZAKI HAMMAND, ISNA President; JAMAL BADAWI; BASSAM OSMAN; M. MOIN SIDDIQUI; and, JAMAL ZARABOZO. These and other speakers identified by [REDACTED] have been previously characterized as noted above by [REDACTED] as being members and leaders of the IKHWAN. They are also the organizers and leaders of NAIT and its various subsidiary and sponsoring Muslim organizations.

In a communication dated May 24, 1988, the Kansas City Office of the FBI reported that the above conference was held at the KANSAS CITY AIRPORT, MARRIOTT HOTEL and that all arrangements for the convention were coordinated by representatives of ISNA and also the ISLAMIC SOCIETY OF CENTRAL MISSOURI. Expenses for the conference were paid on both personal and certified checks drawn on the account of the ISLAMIC SOCIETY OF NORTH AMERICA. The anticipated attendance for the conference was between 250 and 300 attendees.
