- The government's right, in a prosecution for perjury or false statement, to use against the defendant any statement that the defendant gives under oath;
 - 2. The right to persist in a plea of "not guilty";
 - 3. The right to a speedy and public trial;
- 4. The right to trial by jury, or the ability to waive that right and have a judge try the case without a jury;
- 5. The right to be represented by counsel-and if necessary to have the court appoint counsel-at trial and at every other stage of the proceeding;
 - 6. The right at trial to confront and crossexamine adverse witnesses, to be protected from compelled self-incrimination, to testify and

The court excludes time from 10/29/2015 through 1/1/2016 pursuant to 18 USC § 3161(h)(1)(G) on the ground that the District Judge will be considering the proposed plea agreement.
