b. Defendant shall possess and/or use only those digital 1 devices and internet accounts that have been disclosed to, and 2 approved by, the Probation Office upon commencement of supervision. 3 Any changes or additions to digital devices or internet accounts are 4 to be disclosed to, and approved by, the Probation Officer prior to 5 the first use of the same. Disclosure shall include both user names 6 and passwords for all digital devices and internet accounts. Digital 7 devices include, but are not limited to, personal computers, tablet 8 computers such as iPads, mobile/cellular telephones, personal data 9 assistants, digital storage media, devices or media which can 10 provide access to electronic games, devices that can access the 11 internet, as well as any of their peripheral equipment. Internet 12 accounts include, but are not limited to, email accounts, cloud 13 storage/services accounts, social media accounts, electronic 14 bulletin boards, or other accounts on the internet; 15

16 c. All cellular/mobile phones, computers, computer-17 related devices, and their peripheral equipment, used by defendant 18 shall be subject to search and seizure. This shall not apply to 19 items used at any employment site, which are maintained and 20 monitored by the employer;

d. Defendant shall comply with the rules and regulations
of the Computer Monitoring Program and shall not be responsible for
the cost of the Program;

e. Defendant shall provide the Probation Officer with
all billing records for any service or good relating to any digital
device or internet account, including those for cellular telephone,
cable, internet and satellite services, as requested by the

Probation Officer, so that the Probation Officer can verify
 compliance with these requirements;

f. Defendant shall submit his person, property, house, residence, post office box, storage facility, vehicle, papers, computer, cellular telephone, other electronic communication or data storage devices or media, and effects to search at any time, by any law enforcement officer with or without a warrant and or with or without reasonable or probable cause;

9 g. As directed by the Probation Officer, defendant shall 10 provide to the Probation Officer: (1) a signed release authorizing 11 credit report inquiries; (2) federal and state income tax returns 12 and a signed release authorizing their disclosure and (3) an 13 accurate financial statement, with supporting documentation as to 14 all assets, income, expenses, and liabilities of the offender; and

h. Defendant shall not associate with anyone known to
him to be a member of Jam'iyyat Ul-Islam Is-Saheeh ("JIS")
organization and others known to him to be participants in JIS'
criminal activities.
