AA: Right.

The people have no aim in life to them everything in this life alone. They think that when this life is over nothing left and everything is put to end. The Americans are to begin are heavily armed from head to toe in kilograms, where mujahideen are light weight and have only a gun with them. The Americans can't even run the rockets will burn them. The mujahideen have so much spirit in them that Americans are scared even from their own planes, that they think that they're not their own. Allah has put a lot of terror in their hearts. There is not a single day when an American is not killed, not a single day.

CW-2: Hum.

ED: Read it good, read it good, because he says the Americans lie, we don't lie cause it's a sin.

DD: The media are all a bunch of liars. Taliban never lies about their casualties because lying it's a sin.
