In 1963, the Supreme Court of the United States issued a landmark decision, unanimously ruling that the U.S. Constitution mandates the right to counsel for indigent clients in criminal cases. As a result, public defender offices began forming around the country to afford due process of law for impoverished populations.

As a trial attorney for one of the nation's largest Public Defender offices, Ryan became proficient in trial advocacy skills through zealously advocating for thousands of clients. Ryan litigated hundreds of cases in an effort to combat the institutionalized racism that permeates the criminal justice system in the United States. While listening to each client's story and learning about the countless civil liberty violations suffered by his clients, Ryan engaged in legal work that sought vindication for civil liberty and civil rights violations, as well as promoting meaningful policy change.

More recently, Ryan started his own law firm where he represented individuals who were victims of police and prison misconduct.

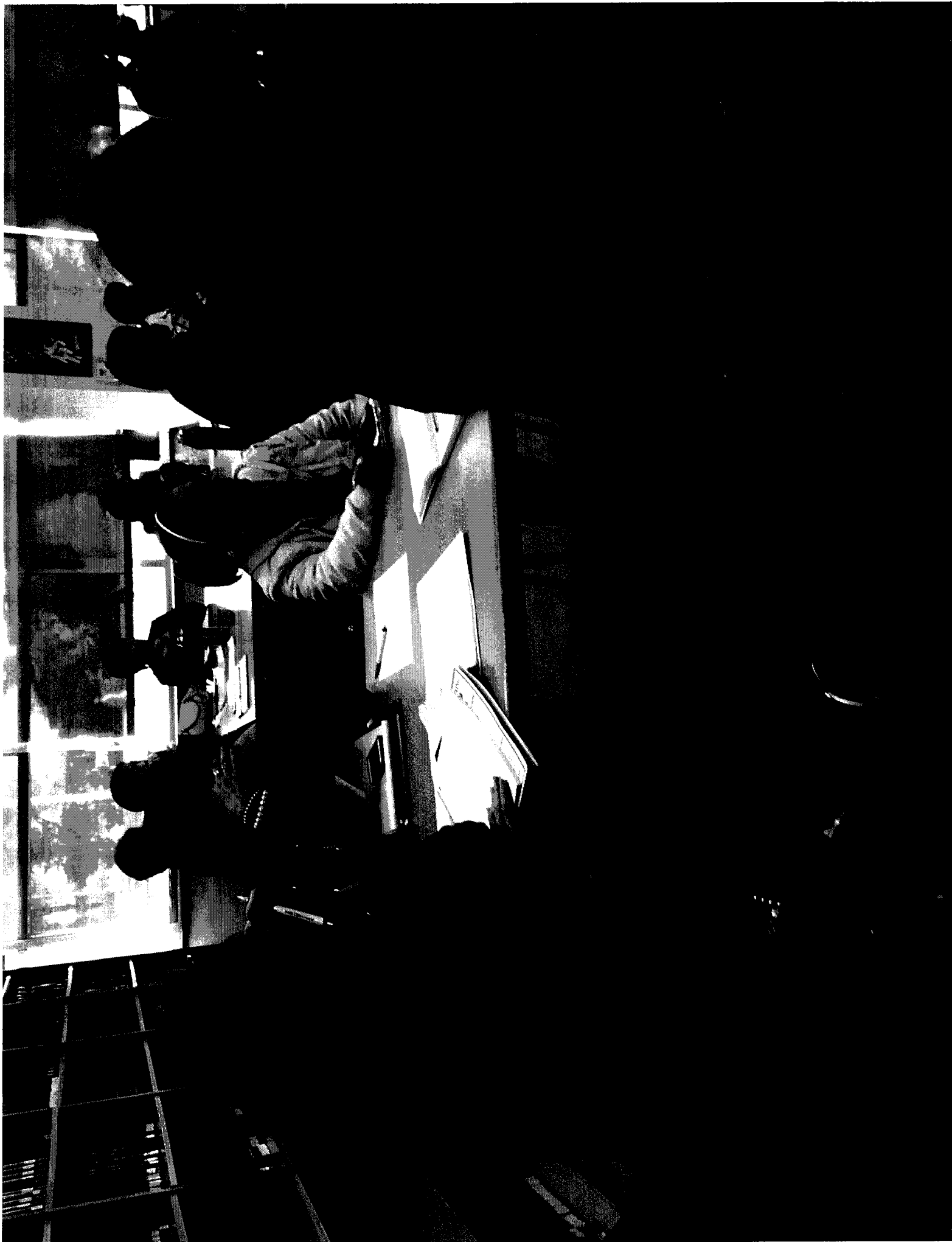

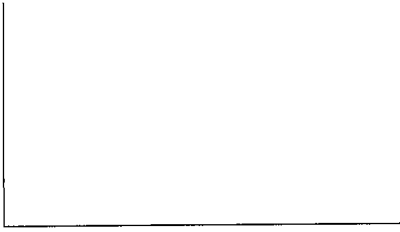

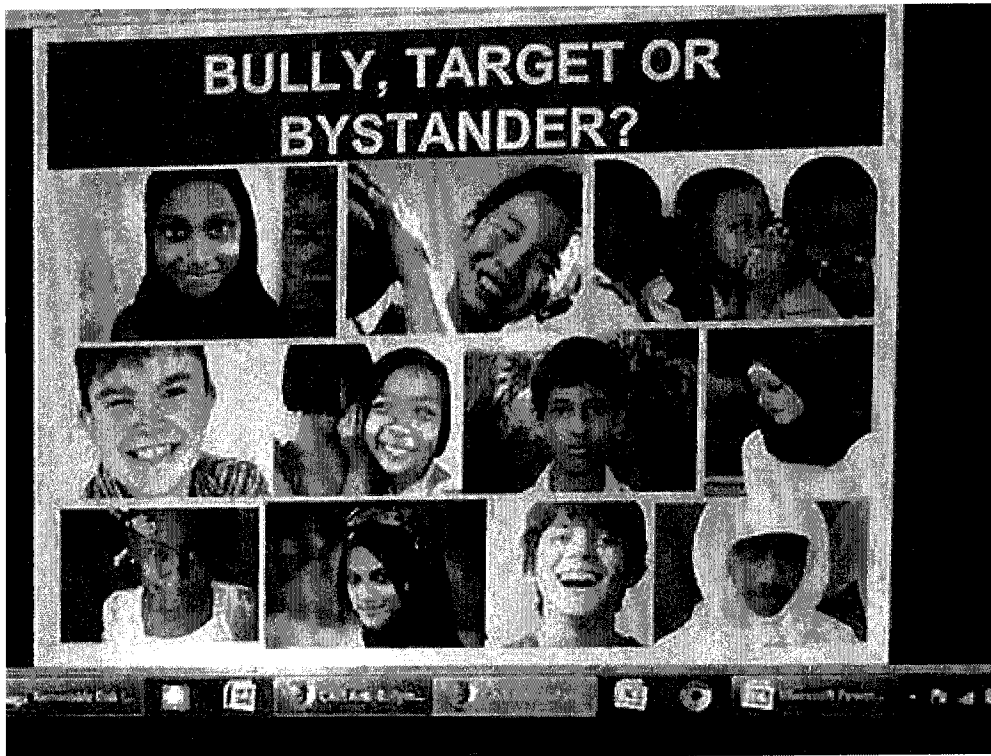

The School District of Philadelphia is the 8th largest in the country, with over 130,000 students. Additionally, it is estimated that about 1 in 5 students in the district are Muslim.

In the current political environment, Muslim American students are facing increased rates of bullying, emotional abuse, physical threats, and verbal epithets due to their faith, race, or ethnicity. Studies have shown a direct negative effect on student's mental health and academic performance.

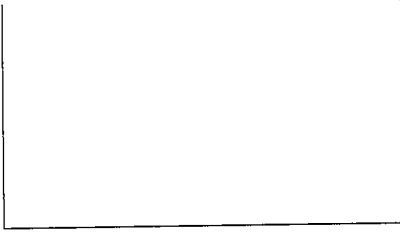

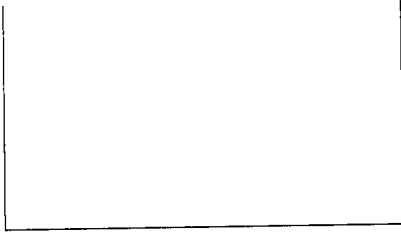

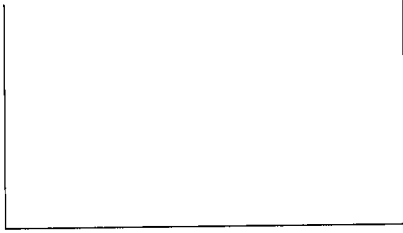
